

Banner Regulations

The banner regulations changed in 2014, so that only the images of banners shown below are authorised for use by Cadet Branch. This is covered in pages 39-40 of the ADRs at Part 8 Section 5.

The use of “King’s” crowns is officially not yet authorised, however most of our sales are now of King’s crowns so that units appear current. You may opt to commission a banner using either crown at your own discretion.

However, individual units continue to purchase the now discontinued banners for varying reasons. In the case of the ACF this is often because it is much easier to display Detachment and County names on them. We have had ACF Counties equip all of their Detachments with the older design of banners with King's crowns on them.



To make the decision more complex, the ACF have recently renewed their brand standard, to include a solid white background to the ACF crest. This does not automatically translate to the older Detachment banners as they are discontinued, however we will produce the older banner in the new brand standard with the appropriate crown if you decide that you want to commission that option.



We will design the banner to your requirements and send a proof for authorisation. Once a design has been commissioned and approved by you, it will be manufactured to your design as a bespoke order. As it is a bespoke order then you may wish to embellish it further, which we can facilitate at additional cost.
